Question 1:

On which legal ground Glen-Eira city council was entitled to reject at the city council's session of the 8th of February 2023 any questions related to Smart Cities and the 5G massive roll-out in our neighbourhood, knowing that the same questions have also been submitted by other constituents to other City councils such as Whitehorse and Monash councils who have allowed these questions to be addressed to them and to be shared at their councils sessions?

Answer:

The Local Government Act 2020 provides that a Council must develop, adopt and keep in force Governance Rules for or with respect to the conduct of Council meetings. On 11 August 2020, Council adopted its Governance Rules. A copy of Council's Governance Rules is available on Council's website. Rule 31(6) of the Governance Rules provides that members of the public wishing to submit written questions to Council must submit those questions in accordance with the guidelines titled 'Written Public Questions to Council'. Council guidelines, which are also available on Council's website, provide that a question that is deemed appropriate upon the grounds set out in section 16 of the guidelines, may be referred to a member of staff to answer.

Question 2:

Many people have noticed at the latest council of Glen Eira held the 8th of February 2023 that the access to the council room was not properly facilitated. People wishing to attend the council were confused between 2 possible entrances before being blocked outside since the doors could only be opened if someone was already inside to activate the opening but not a single employee from the council was there to welcome and direct people. Could the Council of Glen Eira make sure that the access to the council remains possible for anyone wishing to attend?

ANSWER:

Access to the Customer Service entrance at the Town Hall is available from 8.00am-5.30pm on business days. The entrance for Council Meetings and other events held at the Town Hall after hours is located on the Corner of Glen Eira Rd and Hawthorn Rd of the Town Hall. Details of the entrance to be used by members of the public wishing to attend Council meetings is listed on the Cover Page of every Council Agenda, which is made public in the week prior to the meeting and is also published on Council's website.

Question 1:

Could Council please advise the total direct and indirect costs incurred by the City of Glen Eira in relation to the development of plans for railway station car parks on behalf of the Commonwealth, and those otherwise incurred by Council concerning the abandoned Urban Congestion Fund commuter carparks initiative; and whether all or which of those expenses have been reimbursed to the Council by the Commonwealth.

ANSWER:

Council received Commonwealth
Government funding totalling \$500k per site
(\$1M in total) to progress feasibility and

development phase for the multi-Deck carparks at locations in both Elsternwick and Bentleigh.
The total direct and indirect costs for the project was \$835,187, which was fully funded by the Commonwealth Government. The remaining balance amount of \$164,813 was returned to the Government.

- 4. as part of its community engagement process invites both written and verbal submissions on the proposed sale; and
- 5. resolves that in the event that no submissions are received a further report be presented to the Council to determine whether to sell the land, part of the land or not to sell the land; and
- 6. resolves that in the event that submissions are received, Council will consider the submissions at a future Ordinary Council Meeting and determine whether to sell the land, part of the land or not to sell the land.

 - d) Turpentine Tree (*Syncarpia glomulifera*) located Caulfield Park, Caulfield North 442/CTR/2022;
 - e) Bunya Pine (*Araucaria bidwillii*) located at Caulfield Park, Caulfield North 443/CTR/2022; and
