## Summary of meeting minutes from previous meeting

The previous Community Grants and Awards Advisory Committee meeting on Tuesday 21 November 2023 made recommendations to Council on four Facility Hire Grant applications and one Small Grant. The minutes were adopted by Council at the Ordinary Council Meeting on 19 December 2023.

#### 6 Items for discussion:

## 6.1 Annual Community Grants 2023-2024 - Hamerkaz Shelanu CGP 2324 - 001

Hamerkaz Shelanu applied for a Partnership and Event grant in the Community Grants Program for 2023-2024. The group's application to host the Purim Festival at Luna Park in March 2024 was unsuccessful. The group has submitted a request to have its application reviewed by Council as it has now relocated the event to Caulfield Racecourse.

The Purim Festival is planned to take place on Sunday 24 March 2024. By changing the venue to Caulfield Racecourse, a venue within Glen Eira, the grant application now meets the criteria outlined in the Community Grants Guidelines. There is sufficient budget available to support the approval of this grant.

Recommendation: The Committee recommends that Council approves the Hamerkaz Shelanu application for \$10,000 to support the Purim Festival event

at Caulfield Racecourse on Sunday 24 March 2024.

#### 6.2 Senior Citizen Centre Allocations and Grants

Council has 33 Senior Citizens Groups operating out of Council's community facilities. These groups have recently submitted their annual Centre Allocations and Grants Applications for 2024. A total of 32 Senior Citizens Groups have elected to apply for a Senior Citizens Centre Grant.

The recommended funding for 2024 has considered the Glen Eira membership for each Senior Citizens' Group, their hours of service and level of weekly activity. The recommended grants for Senior Citizens Groups total \$97,677 and are detailed below. The budget allocation for 2023-24 is \$95,273. The shortfall can be covered within the overall Community Grants budget.

#### 6.3 Facility Hire Grants:

# 6.3.1 Maccabi Victoria FH 24 - 003

Maccabi Victoria submitted a Facility Hire Grant application on 15 January 2024 to hire the Caulfield Park Pavilion on Monday 18 March 2024 at a cost of \$304.50 to hold a Friends of Maccabi Luncheon Celebration.

Maccabi Victoria connects the Jewish community through sport and wellbeing focusing on encouraging people to participate in physical activity through sport and other community activities, while maintaining a strong Jewish identity.

This event provides an opportunity for past and present Maccabi participants to come together to connect with fellow community members. It is expected that 90 people will attend of which 75 are residents of Glen Eira. Maccabi Victoria is selling tickets to this event at a cost of \$66 per person.

The luncheon aligns with the aims of the Facility Hire Grant program to assist community organisations/groups to undertake projects and activities that contribute to the liveability, accessibility, health and safety of Glen Eira.

Actions: Officers to provide details to the Committee on providing Facility

Hire Grants to organisations selling tickets for activities and events. This report will also include consideration of project budgets as part of the assessment of Facility Hire Grant

applications.

# 6.3.2 Australian Breastfeeding Association - Inner South East Melbourne Group FH 24 - 006

The Australian Breastfeeding Association – Inner South East Melbourne Group submitted a Facility Hire Grant application on 23 January 2024 to hire the Murrumbeena Park Community Room on six weekends between 20 April and 14 December 2024 at a cost of \$2,697 and the Carnegie Children's Multipurpose Centre on Monday afternoons on a twice monthly basis from 5 February 2024 to 16 December 2024 at a cost of \$829.40 to hold Breastfeeding Education Classes and local group breastfeeding support catch up sessions. The group's request totals \$3,526.40.

The Group has 192 Glen Eira residents as members and expects 30 people to attend each Breastfeeding Education Class and up to 15 people to attend each support catch up session.

This program aligns with the aims of the Facility Hire Grant program to encourage community initiatives that promote self-sufficiency, innovation and respond to community needs and fund projects that deliver meaningful social impact and strengthen community capacity to plan and implement services.

Recommendation: The Committee recommends that Council funds a Facility Hire

Grant of \$3,526.40 for Australian Breastfeeding Association – Inner South East Melbourne Group's hire of the Murrumbeena Park Community Room and the Carnegie Children's Multipurpose Centre to hold breastfeeding education classes and breastfeeding

support catch up sessions throughout 2024.

#### 6.3.3 Integral Yoga Centre of Melbourne FH 24 – 005

The Integral Yoga Centre of Melbourne submitted a Facility Hire Grant application on 18 January 2024 to hire the Murrumbeena Park Community Room for five weekly Yoga for Every Body classes from 8 January 2024 to 31 July 2024 at a cost of \$7,425. The five weekly Yoga for Every Body classes are on Monday and Wednesday mornings, two on Monday evening and one on Tuesday evening. The Group has 100 Glen Eira residents on their database and expects up to eight people per session with three Glen Eira residents expected to benefit.

This project aligns with the aims of the Facility Hire Grant program to fund projects that deliver meaningful social impact, support celebration and participation in community life and help strengthen community capacity to plan and implement services. However, the Committee considered the number of Glen Eira residents benefitting from this activity to be not providing sufficient community benefit.

Recommendation: The Committee recommends that Council not fund a Facility Hire

Grant of \$7,425 for Integral Yoga Centre of Melbourne to hire the Murrumbeena Park Community Room from 8 January 2024 to

31 July 2024.

#### 6.4 Small Grants

#### 6.4.1 Bayside Community Emergency Relief SGP 2324 – 019

Bayside Community Emergency Relief submitted a Small Grant application on 23 November 2023 to request funding support for their partnership work with Taskforce Community Agency. A grant of \$1,000 is requested to purchase items for their *ResetLife, Smart Recovery Youth and Youth Outreach program.* The program helps rehabilitate young people aged 11-25 years who are experiencing drug and alcohol issues, by providing counselling packs which include basic toiletries, beanie, drink bottle, textbook and pencils or pens for school, activities items such as paint by numbers or colouring books in reusable bags.

This project aligns with the aims of the Small Grants program, specifically the initiative supports a strong and safe community that connects people and enhances health and wellbeing.

Recommendation: The Committee recommends that Council funds a Small Grant of

\$1,000 to Bayside Community Emergency Relief to provide Taskforce Community Agency Emergency counselling packs.

#### **6.4.2 Zionism Victoria** SGP 2223 – 016

Zionism Victorian submitted a Small Grant application under the auspice of the Beth Weizmann Community Centre to support special information sessions for its community garden project. Topics may include pickling produce or successful pruning.

Funding of \$1,000 is requested consisting of \$400 for seedlings, mulch and soil and \$600 for coordinator time.

As the Guidelines for the Small Grants program lists ongoing staff salaries under 'What will not be funded', the costs for a coordinator is not recommended for funding.

The project aligns with the Small Grants program aims to deliver neighbourhood projects that support social inclusion and community connectedness.

Recommendation: The Committee recommends that Council funds a Small Grant of

\$400 for Zionism Victorian under the auspice of the Beth

**Weizmann Jewish Community Centre to support its community** 

garden project.
