

Street numbering

Everyday of the year Council is hard at work to ensure Glen Eira is a safe place to live, work and visit. Council safety initiatives encompass almost every aspect of community life.

Property identification plays a significant part ensuring our community retains a high level of safety across the municipality.

In addition to having your guests, customers, personal mail and emergency services arriving on time, clear and concise property identification could assist in reducing the number of vehicle and pedestrian accidents within the community.

Council recognises the importance of property numbering in that *Local Law Clause* 420 — Street Numbering was introduced to ensure safe delivery of any service to your door.

How do you judge whether your property meets acceptability?

For the purpose of this local law, the display of the number of the property on a fixture associated with the property includes the painting of an approved property number on the kerb immediately adjacent to any driveway crossover, or the authorised display of the property number on any street fixture immediately adjacent to the property such as a power pole.

Simply put, if the number is readily seen and visible it is acceptable to be located:

- on a building;
- on a fence;
- on the kerb adjacent to a driveway; and
- on a street fixture immediately adjacent to property.

How will the inspections of properties for street numbering compliance occur?

Direct response to complaints received from emergency services, disability groups, service utilities and the like will occur, however this inspection will be incorporated into current inspection programs involving overhanging vegetation, footpath display inspections, unsightly properties and responsible pet ownership programs.
