(a) A petition with 374 signatories and reading as follows was submitted to the Council Meeting:

"This petition of certain residents of the City of Glen Eira draws to the attention of the Council the failure of the Minister for Public Transport and the Level Crossing Removal Authority (LXRA) to conduct public forums on the issue of elevated rail and failure to put the proposal to full and genuine consultation as per the Council's motion of 23 February 2016 and Council's letter to the Minister of 26 February 2016.

The LXRA conducted one additional information session in Glen Eira on the proposal but this could not be considered in any way to be public consultation nor does it meet the request of Council for full and genuine consultation. This information session had limited advertising and detailed plans were not available nor were any reports as requested by Council. Your petitioners therefore pray that Council advises the Premier and Minister for Transport (copying correspondence to persons and media included in Council's letter to the Minister for Transport of 26 February 2016) and the LXRA of Council's objection to the implementation of the elevated rail proposal until all options and related reports including business and cost analysis have been made open for public scrutiny and full consultation.

Your petitioners also pray that Council will make further requests of the Victorian Government to provide full reports on noise, environmental, amenity and community impacts, vibration analysis, safety, cost benefit analysis and that these reports include and not be limited to an Environmental Effects Statement.

And your petitioners will ever pray."

"Has Council approved any permits relating to any work (preliminary or project work) currently being undertaken, or to be carried out in the future, by the LXRA in the Glen Eira area? If so, are you able to provide us with details of these permits?"

The Mayor read Council's response. He said:

"The State Government's Cranbourne Pakenham Rail Corridor Project covers nine Councils.

In 2014, the Minister for Planning in the previous State Government exempted the Project from needing town planning permission from any of the nine Councils. It exempts the Project from needing to comply with the Glen Eira planning scheme controls and policies you guoted.

The documentation supporting the Ministerial exemption states, amongst others:

"Despite any provision to the contrary or any inconsistent provision in the Melbourne, Yarra, Stonnington, Glen Eira, Greater Dandenong, Monash, Kingston, Casey and Cardinia Planning Schemes, no planning permit is required for, and nothing in the abovementioned planning schemes operates to prohibit or restrict: use or development of land in the Project Area for the purposes of the project etc...."

All supporting documentation is available from the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning website.

Asset Consent Permits are required for any works to be undertaken in Council road reserves, regardless of the Ministers exemption. At this point in time, Council has received one permit application for the purpose of geotechnical investigative works at Lorne Street, Caulfield East."

Subject:	Grade Separation project.

"The Government claims that 11 MCG's worth of open space will be available under the Skyrail. The actual plans from Grange to Poath Roads show these to be massive car parks joined by short, broken paths and flanked by residential back fences. Victoria Police Information Units identify these areas as 'crime hot spots' that invite loitering in areas which cannot be adequately patrolled. For over 100 years, our community has recognised that this is a rail corridor and not a playground. Rail Under Road with cut and cover will make real space available without the huge concrete pylons and tracks overhead. How is council going to address problems the proposed skyrail will bring such as graffiti, rubbish dumping and criminal activity? What plans are there for addressing these issues around the new station district that Council will be responsible for when Hughesdale Station is moved into Glen Eira?"

The Mayor read Council's response. He said:

"There is no proposal before Council to manage the open space associated with the Skyrail proposal. Graffiti on railway infrastructure is the responsibility of the railway companies and antisocial behaviour is dealt with by Victoria Police. All these matters have been raised by Council in our submission to the LXRA which is available on the front page of Council's website."

From: Subject: Ms M Ridgeway Property valuations

"Can Council please explain how the valuations on our properties will be calculated this year and what affect the elevated railway project will have on property valuations and rates?"

The Mayor read Council's response. He said:

"At this early stage, it is difficult to give any indication as to the impact that the State Government's Skyrail project may have on valuation movements. As Council valuations and associated rates are dependent on market levels through sales analysis, Council needs to have some sales evidence to establish an accurate movement. Additionally, the State Government's recent announcement regarding a buy-back proposal for impacted properties may also affect the likely consideration to be paid for those properties.

Council's valuers are currently appraising sales data as well as any other factors that may influence the value of properties along this corridor. If this evaluation establishes any impact on market levels then Council will adjust valuations and rates accordingly."

1. Community Plan

Town Planning and Development: To manage the rate and extent of change to the built environment consistent with State and Local Planning Policies to achieve a diversity of housing as sympathetic as possible to neighbourhood character.

2. Recommendation

That Council:

• Issues a Notice of Decision to Grant a Planning Permit for Application No. GE/PP-24302/2011/A allowing variation to the wording of Conditions 2 and 7 in accordance with the conditions contained in the Appendix.

3. Applicable Policies and Codes

Glen Eira City Council

- Municipal Strategic Statement Adopted by Council on 17 May 1999 and approved by the Minister on 5 August 1999.
- Child Care Centres Policy Adopted by Council on 22 February 2011 and amended by the Minister on 14 January 2016.

4. Reasons For Recommendation

In recommending that Council determines to approve the proposal, consideration has been given to:

- All written objections and matters raised at the planning conference
- Council's MSS
- Council's Child Care Centres Policy
- Other relevant considerations of the Planning Scheme

The key issues influencing the recommendation are as follows:

Background

A Planning Permit was approved by VCAT on the 7 June 2013 which allowed for a 120 place Child Care Centre with parking.

Condition 2 of the planning permit required that the child care centre could only operate between the following times:

Monday to Friday- 7:00am to 6:00pm

Condition 7 of the planning permit requires that playground areas 2 and 3 must not be used between the hours of 4:00pm on one day and 9:00am on the following day.

Compliance with Council's Child Care Centres Policy

The Neighbourhood Residential Zone enables the consideration of proposals for a range of non-residential uses serving local community needs in appropriate locations.

Council's Child Care Centres Policy aims to integrate these facilities into residential areas whilst minimising their impacts on the amenity of adjoining and nearby dwellings and protecting neighbourhood character.

Car parking, vehicle access, car park layout and traffic

- No changes are proposed to the approved layout of the basement and/or drop off and pick up areas within the basement.
- Staff numbers will remain unchanged. Therefore staff car parking will not change as a result of the extended hours of operation.
- It is considered that any impact on existing parking and/or traffic congestion within Glen Eira Road and/or Morrice Street will be negligible.

General Amenity

- The proposed extension to the approved hours of operation from 6:00pm to 6.45pm exceeds the finishing time prescribed in the Child Care Centres Policy by 15 minutes.
- A condition is included in the recommendation to limit the finishing time to 6.30pm in line with the prescribed times set out in the Child Care Centres Policy.
- The proposed extension to the approved hours of Playground Areas 2 and 3 falls within the prescribed times set out in the Child Care Centres Policy.
- The proposed extended hours to use Playground Areas 2 & 3 for an additional 15 minutes in the morning and an additional 1 hour and 45 minutes in the afternoon is considered acceptable given that noise impacts will be minimised by:
 - The existing 2 metre high acoustic paling fence erected along the northern boundary adjacent to Playground Area 2 at ground floor.
 - The existing 2.1 metre high acoustic barrier erected along the northern and western boundaries of Playground Area 3.
- The permit applicant did offer to limit the use of Playground Areas 2 & 3 during the middle of the day. No hours were specified by the permit applicant. The use of Playground Areas 2 & 3 during the middle of the day (as proposed) is considered reasonable and complies with Council's Child Care Centres Policy.
- A condition is included in the recommendation varying the wording of Condition 7 to extend the use of Playground Areas 2 & 3 as proposed.

- The proposed extension to the hours for playgrounds 2 & 3 would cause an increased noise disturbance for nearby residents.
- The increased hours will have a negative impact on neighbors' amenity, health and well-being due to noise impacts.
- The approved hours of operation (i.e. 7am 6pm) and restricted use of playgrounds 2 & 3 (i.e. not used between 4pm one day until 9am the following day) is adequate.
- Noise impacts from the playgrounds at ground and first floor.
- Playgrounds 2 & 3 have no acoustic screening.

3. Referrals

The application has been referred to various departments and individuals within Council for advice on particular issues. The following is a summary of relevant advice:

Transport Planning

• The extended operating hours are not expected to have any significant impact on existing traffic conditions within the vicinity of the subject land.

4. Planning Conference

The Conference, chaired by Cr Magee, provided a forum where all interested parties could elaborate on their respective views. Objectors mainly emphasised their original reasons for objection. It is considered that the main issues arising from the discussions were:

- Noise





- An appeal must be made on a Notice of Appeal form which can be obtained from the Victorian Civil & Administrative Tribunal, and be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
- An appeal must state the grounds upon which it is based.
- An appeal must also be served on the Responsible Authority.

1. Community Plan

Town Planning and Development

To manage the rate and extent of change to the built environment consistent with state and local planning policies to achieve a diversity of housing as sympathetic as possible to neighbourhood character.

Community Building and Engagement

To build a strong connected community that actively participates and engages with Council to improve outcomes for the community.

2. Proposal

To commence stakeholder and community consultation for Glen Eira's Planning Scheme Review 2016.

3. Recommendation

That Council:

- Notes the commencement of community consultation for the 2016 Planning Scheme Review
- Notes and endorses the attached Discussion Paper

4. Background

A *Planning Scheme* is a statutory document that outlines the strategic direction for a municipality and provides objectives, policies and provisions for development and land use. A *Planning Scheme* consists of a range of tools that aid councils in making decisions on where and how people develop their land, including both state and local policies.

Pursuant to Section 12B of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*, a municipality must regularly review its *Planning Scheme* and report the findings to the State Government. Council is required to report its *Review* findings to the Minister for Planning, through the Department of Environment, Land Water and Planning (DELWP).

The Review in its broadest sense aims to test the continued relevance and applicability of all Council town planning policies, strategies and controls. This provides an opportunity for Council to consult with stakeholders and the community and to seek feedback, comments and views on planning matters within Council's ambit of responsibility.

Item 9.2 (cont'd)

The last planning scheme review was undertaken in 2010. Generally, planning scheme reviews are undertaken approximately every 4 years. However, the State Government has a number of significant reviews of its own which have been ongoing. It was considered that deferring Glen Eira's planning scheme review was warranted as the results of the State Government planning reviews had the potential to affect the outcomes of Glen Eira's own planning scheme review.

These State reviews have been progressing much slower than anticipated and it is therefore appropriate for Glen Eira to move forward regardless of the Statewide outcomes.

In 2013, Glen Eira translated its longstanding housing policies into the new residential zones (Ministerial Amendment C110). The translation achieved, amongst other things:

- Mandatory maximum height limits over all residentially zoned land in Glen Eira
- Co-location of higher density development with public transport
- More than the State design standard in the amount of porous areas, private open space and rear setback in the Neighbourhood Residential Zone (the majority of the municipality),
- A scaling down and moving away of buildings in a higher density residential zone, where it meets a Neighbourhood Residential Zone.

The new zones reinforced our Policies and, with mandatory maximum heights, ensured that VCAT could not approve taller buildings.

There is nothing that can be built under the new zones that could not be built before. There are things which could be built before which cannot be built now, especially relating to heights. Glen Eira has achieved a balance. We have gained more protection, whilst still enabling higher density development in appropriate locations.

The State Government is currently reviewing the reformed residential zones. A Ministerial advisory committee has been appointed to report on the implementation and application of the residential zones, and any recommended improvements.

The Committee is expected to report to the Minister in mid 2016. It is considered appropriate to wait for the imminent outcome of the State review before any detailed local review of residential zones is conducted.

The State Government has also commenced the removal of level crossings across Melbourne. The Minister for Planning has appointed a Standing Advisory Committee to provide advice and recommendations on 'integrated development opportunities' created by the removal of level crossings. Developments approved by the Minister at railway stations (Glen Eira's Activity Centres) may have a bearing on the outcomes of the review.

Item 9.2 (cont'd)

5. Community Engagement

An integral part of the Planning Scheme review process is community and stakeholder consultation.

This will involve:

- Five Community Engagement meetings held over April and May at various locations throughout the municipality.
- The Community Engagement meetings will conclude with a sixth community meeting in June at the Town Hall. At the final meeting, the key findings from the previous meetings and written submissions will be presented, giving the community an opportunity for further discussion. Each meeting will be run by an external facilitator, with planning staff in attendance.
- Articles in Glen Eira News and The Leader newspaper.
- Letters to a diverse range of stakeholders.
- On-line discussion on "Have Your Say" Glen Eira.

6. Project Timeframes



At the conclusion of the the Community Engagement process, a report will be presented. The report will detail the submissions and feedback received during the consultation phase. It will also list recommended changes to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of Glen Eira's Planning Scheme. These will form the basis of Council's Strategic Planning workplan over the next four years.

The process to implement the adopted changes will be through a planning scheme amendment process. This process can be a lengthy one with the following fixed statutory steps:

(Depending on the project, significant research may be required prior to commencing the amendment process.)

- The Minister for Planning must firstly authorise preparation of the amendment before exhibition can occur. Following this, notice (exhibition) of the amendment will commence, inviting public submissions. If Council agrees to exhibit an amendment, it does not necessarily follow that Council supports the proposal. Placing an amendment on public exhibition has an element of "testing the water". During the authorisation process, the Minister may also authorise Council to approve the amendment (if minor in nature).
- 2. If there are no submissions Council can 'adopt' or 'abandon' the amendment and forward it to the Minister for certification or approval. It only becomes law when / if it is formally approved and gazetted.

Item 9.2 (cont'd)

- 3. If there are submission/s opposed to the amendment, the Council has three options abandon the amendment, change the amendment in accordance with the submitter's request, or request the Minister to appoint an Independent Panel to hear the submissions.
- 4. If a Panel is appointed, submissions are heard and the panel reports its findings in the form of a recommendation to Council.
- 5. The Panel may make a recommendation to:
 - adopt the amendment;
 - abandon the amendment; or
 - modify the amendment.
- 6. Council then considers the panel report and makes its own decision. Council is not bound by the panel's findings. Again Council's options are to either abandon or adopt the amendment (with or without modifications).
- 7. If Council adopts the amendment, it is then referred to the Minister for Planning for approval or certification.

7. Discussion Paper

The attached Discussion Paper will be available on-line, and in hard copy at all Council libraries.

It has been prepared to initiate discussion on town planning issues and challenges facing the municipality. The paper contains six themes with accompanying questions to prompt thoughts on these and other town planning issues.

The six themes are:

Municipal Strategic Statement and Local Policies Urban Design in Activity Centres Environmentally Sustainable Development Car Parking and Transport Neighbourhood Character Heritage

Glen Eira Planning Scheme Review 2016: a discussion paper

The Glen Eira Planning Scheme Review aims to test the continued relevance and applicability of all Glen Eira City Council's town planning policies, strategies and controls. As part of the Review process, Council will consult with the community to seek feedback, comments and views on planning matters within Glen Eira.



Glen Eira Planning Scheme Re

Context

Melbourne is rapidly growing in population with numbers expected to increase from its current 4.5 million to reach 7.8 million by the year 2051. With a projected significant increase in population over the next 35 years, the number of households in Melbourne is expected to reach 3.15 million by 2051. This would result in a 90 per cent increase from the current 1.59 million households in metropolitan Melbourne¹.

The average household size is expected to decline over the coming years as the average age of Melbourne's population increases. As older people form smaller households, this will result in a larger portion of the population requiring one or two-person homes.



In recent years, metropolitan Melbourne's housing growth has changed focus with the construction of apartment and medium density housing outweighing the construction of detached houses.

Figure 1: Annual approvals of dwellings by type, Melbourne, 2001–2014²

As a middle ring municipality, Glen Eira has experienced a significant increase in housing development in the form of residential infill — the replacement of one house with new townhouses or apartments — with more than 25 per cent of approvals being issued for dual occupancy development¹. Residential infill can increase housing diversity within a municipality however, it may also affect the character of individual suburbs over time. By the year 2031, the population of Glen Eira is expected to increase by approximately 27,000 people, which is expected to result in a further increase of around 12,000 households³.




Figure 2: Annual number of building approvals of mid and high rise apartments in inner and middle Melbourne, 2001–2014²

What is a Planning Scheme?

A *Planning Scheme* is a statutory document that outlines the strategic direction for a municipality and provides objectives, policies and provisions for development and land use. A *Planning Scheme* consists of a range of tools that aid councils in making decisions on where and how people develop their land, including both state and local policies.

A Planning Scheme includes the following components:

State Planning Policy Framework (SPPF)

State-wide policies are contained within this section of the *Planning Scheme*, which comprises of general principles and provisions for land use and development. The *SPPF* is identical for every municipality and is currently under review by the State Government. Information contained in the *SPPF* is not the subject of the *Glen Eira Planning Scheme Review 2016*.

Local Planning Policy Framework (LPPF)

The LPPF is the subject of the Review. This section of the *Planning Scheme* includes local policies that apply solely to Glen Eira and outlines Council's strategic directions for the municipality. The LPPF must be consistent with the general directions of the SPPF and comprises the following components:

Municipal Strategic Statement (MSS)

The MSS details the broad strategic objectives for planning, land use and development in Glen Eira. Additionally, it provides the strategic basis for the local content of the *Planning Scheme*. This section also provides a rationale for zone and overlay requirements in the *Scheme*.

Local Planning Policies

These policies state the preferred outcomes for specific land uses or development in Glen Eira and contain tools for implementing the strategies set out in the MSS.

Zones and overlays

All land in Victoria has a zone that specifies the purpose of the land (residential, commercial, industrial etc.). The zoning of land states the allowable uses as well as the types of construction that require planning permission. The provisions within the zone are set by State Government, however, local provisions may be added through the use of schedules. For example, Glen Eira utilised this tool to implement maximum building heights across all residentially zoned land.

Particular and general provisions

These sections of the *Planning Scheme* contain specific provisions for a range of uses and developments, such as car parking, telecommunications facilities and advertising signs. Similar to the zones, these provisions are also set by the State Government.

Incorporated documents

External documents may be referenced within the *Scheme*, for example, a masterplan for a large area or precinct.

Why Do a Planning Scheme Review?

Pursuant to Section 12B of the *Planning and Environment Act 1987*, a municipality must regularly review its *Planning Scheme* and report the findings to the State Government. Council is required to report its *Review* findings to the Minister for Planning, through the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP).

The aim of the review is to:

- reduce the complexity of processes and controls;
- remove unnecessary permit requirements;
- improve the performance of the Planning Scheme and strengthen its strategic objectives;
- · address key issues faced by the municipality; and
- ensure consistency with state policies and strategies.

The process includes:

- community and stakeholder consultation;
- assessing progress since the last Planning Scheme Review;
- reviewing current policies;
- · identifying policy gaps and inconsistencies; and
- setting goals for implementation of changes to the *Planning Scheme* before the next review.

Although the reformed zones were implemented in 2013, a full review of the *Glen Eira Planning Scheme* has not been carried out since 2010. Council has previously sought further time to undertake a review as multiple State Government policies and strategies that guide the *Planning Scheme* are also currently under review. These include *Plan Melbourne Refresh* — a review of Melbourne's metropolitan *Planning Strategy*; a review of the *State Planning Policy Framework*; a review of the new zones recently introduced to Victoria (such as the new residential zones); and a review of multi-dwelling design standards.

Recommendations in the final report will include a list of proposed changes to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of *Glen Eira's Planning Scheme*. These will be implemented via the *Planning Scheme* amendment process. This process can be lengthy and requires both the adoption of the proposed amendments by Council as well as approval from the Minister for Planning.

How can you participate?

An integral part of the Review process is community and stakeholder consultation.

This will involve three key stages:

- I. Community engagement meetings
- 2. Submissions
- 3. Council feedback forum

Five community engagement meetings will be held during the consultation period. These meetings will give the community an opportunity to contribute to the Review and shape the final report that will be submitted to the State Government.

Council encourages interested parties to attend the community engagement meetings and to provide written comments and views on planning matters affecting Glen Eira.

The Municipal Strategic Statement (MSS) is responsible for setting the strategic direction for land use and development within Glen Eira. It is important to review this section of the Planning Scheme to ensure that it accurately responds to the current needs of the municipality. The key strategies of the MSS should align with state policies and objectives. The current sections of the MSS are listed above in Clauses 21.01–21.14.

Glen Eira's local policies are listed in the *Planning Scheme* as Clauses 22.01–22.12. These policies provide more specific statements or expectations that guide decision-making. Local policies are tools that are used to achieve the objectives identified in the *MSS*. It is important to incorporate local policies in the *Planning Scheme* to help the community understand what the preferred outcomes are for land use and development occurring within the municipality.

Theme 2

Urban design in activity centres

An activity centre is an area that incorporates employment, services, housing and social interaction, often located in close proximity to a public transport hub. These centres can range in size from smaller local centres such as the Patterson Road shopping strip in Bentleigh, to larger urban villages including Bentleigh, Carnegie and Elsternwick. Due to their high level of accessibility, larger-scale activity centres are focal points for higher-density residential development with relatively higher buildings proposed in recent times.

Guidance for development in these areas can include local policies, structure plans, urban design frameworks, zones, and overlay controls. Currently, Glen Eira utilises a combination of zoning and local policies to outline the preferred planning outcomes for its activity centres. High-rise development in commercial zones has recently been raised as a concern as prescriptive height limits do not apply at present.



Local policies

Local policies are guidelines for certain uses or developments specifically within the municipality (rather than a state policy across all *Planning Schemes*). These are used by Local Government as a basis for application decision-making. However, should a decision be appealed at the Victorian and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT), the tribunal is only required to consider local policies, not implement them.

Built form overlays

Built form overlays, such as the Design and Development Overlay, are a planning control used to manage development outcomes. These overlays can introduce objectives for building design as well as particular development requirements. They can also introduce mandatory or discretionary height limits.



Structure plans

Structure plans set general parameters for future development opportunities by providing a desired vision for a particular area, including projected changes in land use. This can offer certainty for residents and developers alike but takes time to implement due to the complexity of research required.

2

Urban Design Frameworks

An Urban Design Framework (UDF) identifies the future aspirations for the physical environment of a defined area. A UDF can earmark particular areas for future transport connections, along with major built, natural, and cultural features. In comparison to a structure plan, a UDF has a stronger focus on built form rather than land use. UDFs are often used in areas undergoing significant change and can inform changes to zoning or built form overlays.

- 2. How should these key issues be prioritised?
- 3. Do adequate policies and controls exist to guide development in activity centres?
- 4. How can activity centres better deliver social housing, low-cost housing, and housing diversity?

- 6. What should these maximum height limits be?
- 7. How should the interface between commercial and residential properties be managed?



Theme 3

Environmentally sustainable development (ESD)

Climate change has been a growing concern in recent years with many councils introducing temporary policies for environmentally sustainable design into their *Planning Schemes*. The policies utilise the *Sustainable Design Assessment in the Planning Process (SDAPP)* program, which introduces assessment tools such as *Sustainable Tools for Environmental Performance Strategy (STEPS)* for residential developments and the *Sustainable Design Scorecard (SDS)* for non-residential developments.

Currently, the *Glen Eira Planning Scheme* broadly identifies environmental sustainability objectives however; it doesn't specifically require development applications to be assessed against ESD standards.

The State Government, as part of *Plan Melbourne Refresh* — a review of Melbourne's metropolitan *Planning Strategy* — discusses the integration of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals within the broader strategic framework for Melbourne, which in turn, will guide council local planning policies. It is argued that State Government policies and provisions hold greater weight for planning decisions than local policies and, therefore, minimum ESD requirements for development should be adopted statewide.



In addition, the State Government is currently undertaking the *Better Apartments* project — an initiative in collaboration with the Office of the Victorian Government Architect — which has the potential to shape future apartment design guidelines to better manage the amenity of apartment living in Victoria. As part of the project, discussion has been raised which suggests that ESD factors such as energy and resources and waste should be implemented as development standards within the Victoria Planning Provisions.

Theme 4

Car parking and transport

Car parking, traffic safety and traffic congestion are issues frequently raised by the community, especially in and around activity centres.

Car parking design and rates for various uses are set by the State Government (Clause 52.06 of the *Planning Scheme*).

For example:

- A medical centre is required to provide five car spaces for the first practitioner providing health services for a site, plus an additional three spaces to every other person providing health services.
- A restaurant is required to provide 0.4 car spaces to each patron permitted at the site.
- For a multi-dwelling development such as an apartment block, one car space is required for each one or two bedroom dwelling, two car spaces to each dwelling with three or more bedrooms, and one visitor car space to every five dwellings within the development.

These rates apply throughout Victoria.

It is common for a planning permit to be sought in order to reduce the car parking requirement for a new use. For example, if a new restaurant requires 10 car spaces to be provided onsite, though it can only provide seven, a planning permit is required for a reduction of three car spaces. An assessment is carried out on a case-by-case basis.

To help guide decisions on car parking rates in some instances, certain planning tools can be utilised such as parking precinct plans, parking overlays or local policies. With controls such as these in place, greater clarity may be provided as to the required provision of car parking within activity centres.

Theme 5

Neighbourhood character

Neighbourhood character is an important element of residential areas that creates a sense of place. When residential land is developed, neighbourhood character forms part of the town planning assessment. Through the use of certain planning tools, existing neighbourhood character can be maintained or a new neighbourhood character can be encouraged.

ResCode is a set of state-wide multi-dwelling development standards that are incorporated into all *Planning Schemes*. These standards have been determined in order to identify reasonable and unreasonable amenity impacts as a result of development, and include objectives for neighbourhood character. As mentioned in Theme 3 the State Government is currently undertaking the *Better Apartments* project, which has the potential to introduce new development standards.

Zoning schedules can be introduced to alter ResCode standards within defined areas. For example, schedule I to the Neighbourhood Residential Zone for Glen Eira has particular variances from ResCode standards to implement certain neighbourhood character aspects identified in our local policies, such as a sense of openness and increased landscaping opportunities. These include increased rear setbacks, increased private open space requirements, decreased site coverage and increased permeability requirements.

For areas that present significant neighbourhood character elements, more restrictive planning controls may be applied, such as the Neighbourhood Character Overlay or the Design and Development Overlay.



A thorough assessment of Glen Eira's significant character areas was undertaken in 2010. As a result of this assessment, the Neighbourhood Character Overlay and Design and Development Overlay were introduced to six separate significant character areas. These controls set specific built form objectives for the area, such as roof pitch, street setbacks and front fencing requirements. No. No.

Theme 6


Heritage

A full review of Glen Eira's Heritage areas was last carried out in 1996 and heritage controls were introduced into the *Planning Scheme* in 1999–2000. Since that time, site-specific reviews have been performed at different locations within the municipality.

In terms of heritage controls, general objectives are captured within the MSS (Clause 21.10), more specific statements or expectations are listed within Glen Eira's *Heritage Policy* (Clause 22.01) and the statutory controls are located within the Heritage Overlay (Clause 43.01).

"Policies supporting more intensive development do not necessarily mean that individual lots will be capable of accommodating three storey apartment-style buildings. On numerous occasions, the Tribunal has commented on the opportunities for a higher building form provided by the consolidation of lots. For instance, consolidation provides the opportunity for larger front and side setbacks and the minimisation of land devoted to driveways. I am satisfied that this proposal takes advantage of those opportunities. It provides one accessway and achieves B17 compliance for a three storey development. It also includes apartments with generous internal and external spaces."

- The subject site is located within the General Residential Zone and the McKinnon Neighbourhood Centre.
- The application was refused on grounds relating to neighbourhood character, visual bulk and mass and inadequate transition to adjoining properties. The application also failed to satisfy a number of ResCode requirements and provided an inadequate number of car parks for visitors.
- The Tribunal held that appropriate regard must be given to policy direction and recent approvals in the area of similar scale when assessing neighbourhood character.

Item 9.3 (cont'd)

- On that basis, the Tribunal held that the proposed development was an appropriate outcome for the site and the neighbourhood character. Further, the Tribunal held that the proposed development afforded an acceptable level of internal amenity for future occupants.
- The Tribunal held that the provision of three visitor car spaces was an acceptable outcome having regard to the scale of the development and availability of car parking in the area.
- On that basis, the Tribunal set aside Council's refusal and directed a permit be granted subject to conditions.



3. Final ECO-Buy Expenditure for 2014/15

As a member of the ECO-Buy program, one of Council's responsibilities is to report on expenditure of environmentally friendly products and services at the end of each financial year.

An interim report was provided to Council on 21 September 2015, showing Council's ECO-Buy expenditure for 2014/15 and progress since 2002/03 as shown in the graph below.

ECO-Buy have now confirmed Council's expenditure for 2014/15.



The following graph highlights the progress for Glen Eira since 2002/03.

Item 9.4 (cont'd)

The 2014/15 year saw a total spend of \$3,738,642 compared with \$3,582,908 in 2013/14, an increase of 4.3%. This increase is largely due to improved procedures to capture recycled asphalt and 'green' printing services provided to Council.

It is common for variations or spikes to occur between different reporting periods due to one-off or periodic purchases or Council's capital works program.

4. Membership of the ECO-Buy Program

Council was initially advised at the 3 February 2015 Council Meeting that Ernst & Young acquired "Netbalance" (the company that owned ECO-Buy). Council was further advised on 21 September 2015 that there were minor changes to the nature of services provided by ECO-Buy (with the cost of membership remaining at \$2,500 per year), and that the Purchasing Manager would continue to monitor developments under the new structure.

Over the last 6-12 months, participation by Victorian Councils in the ECO-Buy program has reduced to six. Two of the main reasons for joining the ECO-Buy program were to benchmark Council's expenditure against other Councils within the program and share information and ideas on improving environmentally friendly purchasing practices. Having only 6 Councils to compare against has made benchmarking less meaningful and reduced the benefits of shared learning.

Council has a committee who are responsible for purchasing "green" products and investigating the possibility of increasing the range of "green" products purchased. Thought leadership in "green purchasing" is provided through this committee. The purchase of green products will continue under the guidance of this committee in compliance of the procurement policy, and reports on the purchase of green products will be presented to Council annually with expenditure measured against prior years.

5. Recommendation

That:

- 1. The final expenditure on ECO-Buy for 2014 -15 is noted; and
- 2. Council no longer continues membership of the ECO-Buy program.

1 TITLE

Donations for Provision of Park Benches

2 OBJECTIVE

The objectives of this Policy are to

- 2.1 enable financial donations to Council in order to assist Council to provide benches in Council parks; and
- 2.2 enable recognition of persons through a Council plaque affixed to a Council bench.

3 POLICY

- 3.1 Public open space owned or controlled by Council is managed by Council in the best interests of the Glen Eira community as a whole.
- 3.2 All matters under this policy are determined by Council in its absolute discretion.
- 3.3 Any recognition of any individual will be subject to Council's unqualified responsibility for the management of public open space owned or controlled by Council.
- 3.4 This policy and any actions taken under it do not create or confer any rights, property or otherwise, in relation to land owned or controlled by Council.
- 3.5 Council does not accept responsibility for permitting the installation of a plaque that at a later date is subject to a dispute between relatives or the community.
- 3.6 Council notes that opportunities exist in cemeteries, places of worship and on private property for individuals to be recognised with no involvement by Council.
- 3.7 In managing public open space in the best interests of the community as a whole and in its absolute discretion, Council will have regard to the following guidelines.

4 GUIDELINES

- 4.1 Donations
 - 4.1.1 Donations may be offered to Council to assist Council to provide benches in parks. Council will not accept any conditions attached to a donation.
 - 4.1.2 Donations must be monetary only. Donations of benches or other goods will not be accepted under this policy.
 - 4.1.3 The quantum of donation under this policy will be set by Council from time to time having regard to the cost of supplying, installing and maintaining a bench in an unprotected environment. The quantum at the time of adoption of this policy is in Schedule 1.
 - 4.1.4 Council may accept or decline any donation in its absolute discretion.

4.2 Personal Recognition in Public Open Space

- 4.2.1 Subject to the following section, the donor may indicate whether they would like a plaque of personal recognition (as provided for later in these guidelines) and, if so, may indicate a non-binding preference for a particular park and general location within the park.
- 4.2.2 Plaques of personal recognition will not be located in proximity to sites of general recognition including, but not limited to:
 - War Memorials (eg those in parts of Caulfield Park, Bentleigh Reserve, Memorial Park, Koornang Park, Hopetoun Gardens, McKinnon Memorial Garden) or
 - recognition of Indigenous significance (eg Mallanbool Reserve, Booran Reserve).
- 4.2.3 The need for benches, the location of benches and the type of benches will be determined solely by Council and informed by Council's Open Space Strategy, Park Master Plans, other Council policies and land management considerations. Benches remain the property of the Council.
- 4.2.4 If Council declines the nomination of a particular park or location, a donor may ask to have their proposal retained for future consideration.
- 4.2.5 Plaques will be supplied and installed by Council, will be made of metal 15cm by 5cm, of a uniform design and will remain the property of the Council. The benches and plaques will be maintained by the Council.
- 4.2.6 The text for the plaque will be as follows:



- 4.2.7 Plaques will not recognise anything other than a person or a couple (eg not families, events, causes, groups, organisations, movements, commercial interests etc) or a not-for-profit community group* as recognised by Council's Community Grants criteria.
- 4.2.8 The plaque will not contain other content including, but not limited to, symbols, images, emblems etc.
- 4.2.9 Plaques will not include the identity of the donor.

Donations for Provision of Park Benches

- 4.2.10 Subject to this policy and guidelines, the plaque will be displayed for a period of ten years from the time of its affixing to a bench.
- 4.2.11 At the expiry of the ten year period, Council will use its best endeavours to contact the donor and give the donor the opportunity to make a new donation. If a new donation is made, a further period of ten years commences. If a new donation is not made, the plaque will be removed and Council will use its best endeavours to gift the plaque to the donor.
- 4.2.12 Plaques may be affixed by Council to an existing or additional bench at the quantum of donation referred to in section 4.1.3.
- 4.2.13 Only one plaque will be affixed to any one bench.
- 4.2.14 Council may relocate any bench containing a plaque to another location in the same park at its absolute discretion. Council will use its best endeavours to inform the donor of any such relocation.
- 4.2.15 Council may relocate a plaque to a different bench within the same park at its absolute discretion and will use its best endeavours to inform the donor of the relocation.
- 4.2.16 Council may remove any plaque at any time at Council's absolute discretion and will reimburse the donor part of their donation on a *pro rata* basis. Removal may occur where such recognition has become contrary to community values or where such recognition is detrimental to Council.

5 HUMAN RIGHTS CHARTER COMPATIBILITY

This Policy has been assessed as being compatible with the *Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006.*

Additionally, by letter dated 20 November 2015 the Minister for Public Transport, Hon Jacinta Allan MP, wrote to Council about the grade separation projects and open space in the City of Glen Eira. In her letter the Minister clearly says;

"There may be other opportunities to offset and even increase areas of public open space through project design solutions, such as creating public areas <u>under elevated rail structures.</u>" (The underlining is mine).
