

Terms and Conditions for Participation in the Golden Ticket Competition

Background

This Golden Ticket Competition (**Competition**) is run by Glen Eira City Council (**Council**), in conjunction with participating schools in the Glen Eira municipality, to promote the Active Schools – Go for Gold Program (**Program**). Participation in the Competition and Program is subject to the terms and conditions set out below.

Eligibility

- 1. A person is eligible to enter into the Competition if:
 - (a) enrolled as a student in a participating school between Monday 4 October and Friday 29 October 2021 (**Competition Term**); and
 - (b) not an immediate family member of a Councillor or employee of Glen Eira City Council.

Competition and Prize

- 2. Before the Competition Term, copies of a Golden Ticket (**Ticket**) will be made available to all eligible persons.
- 3. To enter into the Competition, an eligible person must:
 - (a) complete at least 10 (ten) activities to or from school during the Competition Term and have their parent or guardian initial once where indicated on the Ticket for each time they walk, ride or scoot to or from school;
 - (b) write their name, school and grade on their Ticket; and
 - (c) submit their Ticket to their school reception desk by 5:00 pm on Friday 5 November 2021.
- 4. A Ticket will be validly submitted if it complies with all the conditions in this clause.
- 5. An eligible person may submit more than one Ticket during the Competition Term.
- 6. Except as otherwise requested by the school, all validly submitted Tickets will be entered into a draw to win a Fitbit Ace or similar device worth \$99.00 (Prize). There will be a separate draw for each participating school. Clauses 7-11 relate to the award of any Prizes under this clause.
- 7. The winners for each participating school will be drawn by Council staff at 2:00 pm on Friday 12 November 2021 at Glen Eira Town Hall. Council will notify each school of the Prize winner by 5:00 pm on Friday 19 November 2021. Each participating school is responsible for notifying the winner (and, if appropriate, their parent or guardian) in writing and presenting the Prize to the winner no later than Friday 3 December 2021.

- 8. The name of each Student Prize winner and their school may be published on Council's website (www.gleneira.vic.gov.au) between 12 November and 17 December 2021.
- 9. If for any reason, the winner of the Prize for a participating school is unable to attend the Assembly during which the Prize is to be presented, the school is responsible for ensuring that the Prize is given to the winner as soon as practicable. If, despite best endeavours, a participating school is unable to contact the Prize winner within 28 days of the draw, then the Prize will be deemed unclaimed, and Council may hold a further draw to award the unclaimed Prize at its absolute discretion.
- 10. The Council's decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into about the validity of the draw. If there is any dispute about the winner's identity, Council will determine the winner at its absolute discretion.
- 11. The Prize is not transferable, exchangeable or redeemable for cash.
- 12. In addition to the Prize draw described above, Council provides an additional trophy for the participating school, which achieves the highest walking rate per enrolled student during the Competition Term. Regardless of whether a Prize draw is conducted for a particular school, that school may submit collected Tickets to Council to be considered for the trophy.

General

- 13. Council is not liable for late, lost, incomplete, invalid or incorrectly submitted entries, or illegible, corrupted or misdirected entries, claims, or correspondence due to error, omission, alteration, tampering, deletion, theft, destruction, transmission interruption and communications failure or otherwise.
- 14. Council is not liable for any loss (including but not limited to any damage, claim, injury, cost or expense) which is suffered or incurred by any person in connection with or arising from participation in the Competition, or redemption or use of the Prize (if any).
- 15. If for any reason any aspect of the Competition is not capable of running as planned, including because of tampering, unauthorised intervention, fraud, technical failure or any cause beyond the control of Council, Council may, in its absolute discretion, cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the Competition, or invalidate any affected entries.

<u>Privacy</u>

- 16. Council collects personal information from entrants to administer this Competition, including announcing and publishing any Prize winners as set out in these terms and conditions.
- 17. Council may also publish images or other content relating to the Competition and the Program on its print and digital publications, including social media. If such publication results in the use or disclosure of personal information other than as contemplated in clause 8, Council will use reasonable endeavours to seek consent from any individual who can be identified.

18. Personal information collected through this Competition may be used to research and analyse methods of transport to school within the Glen Eira municipality, and aggregated information about participation in the Competition may be passed on to VicHealth.
