

There are several biodiversity hotspots across Glen Eira where birds, mammals, frogs, fish and lizards can be found.

You can discover these plants and animals throughout the City — refer to the map overleaf for locations. This guide represents a snapshot of the biodiversity that may regularly be seen in Glen Eira. It also includes a few species that are less likely to be seen.

Species with the following marks are: endangered species^E; vulnerable species^V; near threatened species^{NT}; and locally rare species^{LR} in Victoria.

The Moorabbin Reservoir has a substantially greater diversity of wild, indigenous flora, that is in a more resilient state than anywhere else in Glen Eira. The site is not open to the public, but flora can be seen from the footpath on Warrigal Road.
