



KEY	MOVES	COMMENT	
1	Establish Selwyn Street as the Precinct Heart		
1.1	Create sense of arrival	Consolidate cultural institutions within Selwyn Street and a focus on Sinclair Street.	
1.2	Reinforce street identity	Better integrate Jewish identity within the streetscape through the design process and consolidated institutions.	
1.3	Concentrate centre of activity	Introduce focus areas in Selwyn Street with new adjacent spaces for activities.	
1.4	Establish cultural event hub	JCAP and Council to partner for programs within the precinct.	
2	Create More Public Space		
2.1	Reduce road width & remove on street parking	Prioritise new public spaces by reducing road width and removing all on street parking in Selwyn Street.	
2.2	Remove kerbs and create shared surface	Create a pedestrian oriented space using a shared surface. Where appropriate, implement sections of removable bollards for limited vehicle access to properties in "event mode".	
2.3	Improve comfort and amenity	Prioritised spaces allow for opportunities to improve public comfort & amenity.	
3	Strengthen Connectivity		
3.1	Improve pedestrian crossings	Implement new pedestrian crossings to improve pedestrian connectivity.	
3.2	Strengthen connection between key destinations and improve wayfinding	Link key educational destinations by implementing new connections between Sholem Aleichem College and Selwyn Street.	
3.3	Improve links to public transport	New key pedestrian crossings and shared street surface treatment seek to create improved pedestrian links between transport modes.	
3.4	Integrate bike infrastructure	Create a street environment that encourages slower moving traffic that can safely accommodate cyclists.	
4	Form One Continuous Public Realm		
4.1	Implement consistent material & plant palette	Will be refined as part of future design.	
4.2	Remove kerbs & create seamless surface treatment	Will be refined as part of future design.	
4.3	Integrate with the wider Elsternwick character	Will be refined as part of future design.	
5	Prioritise Public Space in Strategic Locations		
5.1	Locate public space adjacent key institutions	Adjacent buildings to prioritised public space which will be shaped by occupiers. For example, improve pedestrian access to Woolworths with pedestrian access through the heritage fire station and widened adjacent footpaths.	
5.2	Provide opportunities for events to spill into street	Programmable public space and cohesive street design seek to help life spill into the street. Closing the area south of the car park entrance and "reopening" the north could be accommodated by removable bollards etc.	

6 Express Cultural Identities in Public Domain

Create more transparency 6.1 between public and private realms

Activate public space
6.2 dependent on adjacent program

Street life frontages will be dependent on occupiers. Four focus areas seek to create better definition of how each public/private realms interact with one another.

Public space activation will be highly dependant on adjacent development. It is intended that each space will a dstinctive focus.

Prioritised public spaces seek to provide a range of flexible uses driven by occupiers. Event mode allows for large scale programs.

Will be explored in future design and programming.

Secondary access off Sinclair Street to Selwyn Street during "event mode" with additional access to be further explored. Alternate access can be achieved with movable bollards.

8 Provide Thoughtful Service Management

Integrate access
8.1 requirements for service vehicles

Consolidate service vehicle 8.2 zones to minimise impact on streetscape Will be explored in future design - swept paths as part of concept design.

Consolidated service zones seek to reduce vehicle impact on pedestrian amenity and improve overall safety.



Arts, Youth & Education

Partnering with the school to the north and the future Kadimah development to provide a space that promotes active engagement with the public realm through arts and education.

- Create an exciting and active area that enables a diverse range of programmed uses.
- Provide safe pedestrian connections between Sholem Aleichem College, kadimah and the wider precinct across Sinclair Street.
- Provide safe access to the Jewish Cultural Precinct for visitors.

Civic, Reflective & Respectful

The civic spaces adjacent to the Jewish heart of the precinct (Holocaust Centre and future Jewish Museum) should be curated as respectful spaces that enable passive reflection and recognition.

- Provide opportunity for a curated space for mindful reflection of Jewish histories and futures.
- Incorporate a safe gateway entrance to significant cultural institutions and buildings.
- Consolidate significant cultural institutions to reinforce the Jewish cultural identity.
