



This exhibition showcases the works of the artists selected

as finalists by the judging panel in the three categories: the *A.M.E Bale Travelling Scholarship*; the *A.M.E Bale Art Prize* for oils and/or acrylics; and the *A.M.E Bale Art Prize* for works on paper.

Alice Marian Ellen Bale (1875–1955) was known as one of Australia's pre-eminent flower and still life painters of the early 20th century. She established the *A.M.E Bale Travelling Scholarship and Art Prize* through her will to support Australian artists. The judging panel is comprised of members of the Twenty Melbourne Painters Society Inc who assist Perpetual Trustee Company Limited, as the trustee of The Alice Marian Ellen Bale Art Foundation Trust, in awarding the scholarship and prize.
