3.1 The My Brother Jack (MBJ) Awards

Competition opens: 9am, Monday 3 July 2023

Competition closes: 5pm, Monday 11 September 2023

Awards ceremony: 2pm, Sunday 5 November 2023

Now in its 28th year, the My Brother Jack Awards recognise the outstanding literary achievements of people who live, work or study in Glen Eira. From emerging writers to future literary stars, the Awards celebrate local talent and the stories that shape our community. Prizes are awarded for short stories and poetry in the categories of Primary, Junior Secondary, Senior Secondary, and Open.

The MBJ Awards has become an integral part of the GE Libraries activities. This year, the libraries have planned several related programs and workshops to assist community members to develop and craft their work.

Discussion of the MBJ Awards included the following points:

- Ms Plastow suggested that targeted promotion of the novel My Brother Jack itself be included in marketing of the program, particularly through schools.
- Cr Parasol requested that the MBJ Awards program is included in the Glen Eira Events Schedule.
- Cr Esakoff raised a concern that the Awards finish date and event falls at the end of the school year which could make it difficult for some participants.
- Councillors suggest MBJ could once again be included in the Storytelling Festival program.
- Officers suggest a change to the dates for MBJ Awards 2024 in that the competition starts with the new Summer Storytelling Festival date in February and finishes in June or July as part of the Winter programming of events.

5.1 Recent Events Update

Officers provided an update of events during a super busy month of late April to May.

ANZAC Day

The annual Glen Eira ANZAC Day Commemoration Service was held on Sunday 23 April 2023, at the Caulfield Park Cenotaph.

Formal proceedings were conducted by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and CEO, and included a reading by McKinnon Secondary College school captains. Wreaths were laid by local dignitaries and members from local scout groups and RSLs. Approximately 150 people attended the service including invited guests and general members of the public.

2023 Glen Eira Community Awards

The annual Community Awards presentation events were held on Wednesday 17 May 2023, during National Volunteer Week. The Awards event is a celebration of positive community life, held over two sessions in the afternoon and evening and produced by the Arts and Culture team.

The Awards events comprises film clips, speeches honouring recipients and presentation of Awards by the Mayor for the Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year, Community Group of the Year, Sustainability, Local Hero and Good Neighbour. Volunteer Recognition Certificates were presented by the Mayor to 167 residents from 38 community groups in recognition of their hours or years of service to the community.

For next year, Officers will consider how the event can be delivered to enable opportunities for networking so that recipients on the day can share their experiences and make new connections. There will also be some improvements to the registration process and changes to the announcement of awardees to enable a faster flow of the presentation of awards. There will be a more focussed use of ushers in ensuring that recipients are seen back to their seats and assisted with awards and prizes where required.

Mr Balis suggested that members of the Glen Eira Youth Network are asked to assist with ushering as a positive way to include younger members of the community in Council events.

Action:

Officers will include improvements as discussed when planning next year's event.

Junkyard Beats takes over Glen Eira

Performing arts group *Junkyard Beats* were programmed as one of the interactive arts activities outlined in the Glen Eira Events Schedule over the last two weekends in May.

Junkyard Beats is a percussion-based, musical performance act who transform ordinary household items into musical instruments, thereby promoting recycling and sustainable practices.

The program included workshops (which were booked out very quickly) and stage shows in the Town Hall Auditorium and performances at local shopping precincts, entertaining residents and shoppers with their roving 'Junk Mobile' and pop up 'Flash Mobs'.

Junkyard Beats was a great example of how creative programming can bring connection to our community through music and performing arts. Attracting over 1,900 people of all ages, events such as *Junkyard Beats* are proving to be an effective and positive way of bringing the community into their Town Hall.

Highlights of the feedback received included:

- Hosts were very entertaining. Children were very engaged and loved the event!
- Keep up the great work Glen Eira! Love these free ticketed events on the weekends. A great way to get kids out, especially in winter.
- We were really grateful for the free event thank you. It was a great program.
- Loved that the event wasn't during the school holidays. As great as it is to have school holiday events, it's really nice to have activities on during the school term too.
- Great live act, enjoyed interactive parts, good messages about caring for the environment, kids loved it. And it was free!! Thank you.
- Everyone loved it and was having a great time. No parents were on phones! Presenters were really engaging.
- I loved the message they were sharing regarding the environment, recycling, and being involved in making a difference.
- I am a senior adult. I loved the energy, the rhythm and the total experience. It was a wonderful way to spend an hour on a rainy day.
- Well organised, fun, entertaining, engaging, kids friendly, fantastic community connection.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) 27 May to 3 June

National Reconciliation Week opened this year with over 150 guests attending the launch event in the Gallery. The evening commenced with a Smoking Ceremony and a Welcome to Country, as well as an opening address by the Mayor.

Live performances included *Bandok Tati,* a Wurundjeri young men's dance group and a musical performance by Ngiyampaa man and First Nations singer-songwriter *Pirritu*. Guests also enjoyed The Torch *Confined 14* exhibition and a jewellery-making workshop with Aunty Bronwyn Razem in Gallery 2.

Other NRW events included a First Nations Storytime session at the Bentleigh Hub, exhibition floor talks by The Torch and artists painting live in the Gallery.

The guided flora and fauna tours with Cassie Leatham from the Taungurung/Dja Dja Wurrung people from the Kulin Nation were as popular as ever with over 100 participants. An additional tour was added due to popularity which is a pleasing trend.

Action:

Feedback for this event will be shared with the Committee at a future meeting.

5.2 Glen Eira Events Schedule 2023-24

Officers presented the final Glen Eira Events Schedule 2023-24 to the Committee, accompanied by a map of event locations and discussed some key points. Cr Parasol requested that consideration be given to including the GE Community Engagement Van at events starting with the Rolling Shows at Caulfield Racecourse in August. Officers will discuss with the Community Engagement team as to what events will be most suitable.

Winter programs

In view of the change to the scheduling of the Storytelling Festival from July 2023 to February 2024, some alternative events have been planned for the winter months. Events include a new production by arts group A Blank Canvas - *Lil Robots*, and *Wild City* - a sustainability themed installation with workshops. These are further examples of the interactive arts events that have proved successful with the community.

The monthly *Live Sunday Sessions* will continue in the Gallery as well as a major visual arts exhibition, *Flourish – explore a re-imagined natural world*. The exhibition which has been created by Council's curator will present the work of four contemporary artists and will include a range of floor talks and workshops.

Carols in the Gardens 2023

Planning has begun for the 2023 *Carols in the Gardens* event, building on the elements the Committee had observed were very successful for the community in recent years. This year's event is now confirmed at the historic Rippon Lea Estate on Friday 8 December and will be hosted by performers Lucy Durack and Rob Mills.

Other entertainment will build on last year's success and include a First Nations artist performing in language, a traditional choir, children's entertainment provided by the *Teeny Tiny Stevies* as well as some crowd-pleasing roving performers. Activities will include face painting and arts and crafts and there will be a wide selection of food vendors on site which proved a hit last year.

Summer Stories Festival 2024

Officers provided an update of programming for the new look Summer Stories Festival to be held in February 2024 (previously Storytelling Festival). The Festival will be held in conjunction with the GE Libraries from both a venues and programming perspective.

Programming will continue to feature literacy and literature and will include panel discussions, comedy, author talks, and live music. A highlight of the Festival will be an installation by long-term arts organisation the *Snuff Puppets*. A range of food trucks and a pop-up bar will also be on offer.

Officers will keep the Committee informed of programming in future meetings as more activities are confirmed.

Action:

The Glen Eira Events Schedule will be updated to include the My Brother Jack Awards program. Officers will discuss the inclusion of the GE Community Engagement Van at suitable events starting with the Rolling Shows at Caulfield Racecourse.

5.3 Visual Arts Update

Proposal to move Guy Boyd sculpture

The Boyd family of artists and their circle of friends have a strong connection with Glen Eira, having lived and worked in Murrumbeena over several generations.

Guy Boyd's sculpture *Swimmer Entering the Water* was donated to the City of Caulfield by the late artist's family in 1989. It was unveiled in the City Hall sculpture garden in 1990 in memory of the artist.

In 2012, the sculpture was moved to the entrance of the Glen Eira Sports and Aquatic Centre (GESAC) as part of the site redevelopment.

From time to time, GESAC staff have reported negative feedback about the sculpture in the location in the carpark. Recently, a member of the community asked that the idea of moving the artwork to a better site be explored.

After some discussion of a possible relocation of the artwork back to the original location at the Town Hall or a consideration of the artwork being placed at the new Carnegie Pool, the Committee were of a strong view that the artwork is well suited to the current location at GESAC and should remain there.

The Committee is open to consider the artwork location at some future point. Officers will investigate any logistical requirements of a move of the artwork and may bring the topic to the Committee for consideration at a future meeting.

5.4 City Futures Placemaking Update

Following a presentation on the draft Glen Eira Placemaking Strategy 2023-2027 at an earlier meeting, Mr Balis had asked a follow up question about the activation of vacant shopfronts in activity centres.

Council's Placemaking team have advised that the Glen Eira Placemaking Strategy 2023-2027 was adopted by Council on 2 May 2023. While many possible projects were explored, the Strategy sets out an action plan which directs Council's focus for the next four years. While no actions specifically around the activation of vacant shopfronts were included, we consider vacant shops to be of concern across the municipality and will continue to explore solutions and opportunities.

The nature of these projects – particularly the complexity of working with private property – can be quite challenging and time-consuming meaning that there is no quick fix to the issue. We will provide an update if any projects progress.
