## Pride South East Alliance Make Your Mark - Wear It Purple Bookmark Competition

This competition ('Competition') is run by Glen Eira City Council (Council) in conjunction with the Pride South East Alliance ('Pride South East Alliance' may include the municipalities of Glen Eira, Stonnington, Port Phillip, Bayside, Kingston, Monash, Dandenong, Casey, Mornington Peninsula, Frankston, and Boroondara).

Each Council will run their own competition and manage and judge their own entries independently of each other.

Entrants are asked to design a bookmark that responds to the theme 'Bold Voices, Bright Futures'. The Competition winner will be the one who comes up with the most creative and original design.

The competition opens on Friday 4 August 2025 at 9am and runs until Sunday 10 August 2025 at 11.59pm.

Finalists in the Pride South East Alliance *Make Your Mark -* Wear It Purple Bookmark Competition will have their entry;

- professionally printed and made into a bookmark that will be available for customers to take in Glen Eira Library branches for a limited time.
- exhibited at the City of Glen Eira Art Gallery.

Winning entry may also be;

- published on Glen Eira Youth Services Instagram
- published by the Alliance Councils on their social media platforms
- may also be exhibited by the Alliance Councils in their municipalities.

## Terms and conditions of entry

- 1. By entering this Competition, entrants accept these terms and conditions of entry.
- 2. Eligibility
  - (a) Entrants must live, work or study within the City of Glen Eira.

- (b) Entrants must be between 12 and 18 years old. Entrants under the age of 16 must obtain their parent or guardian's consent by way of signature where it is indicated below.
- (c) Council may require entrants to provide proof to the satisfaction of Council that:
  - i. they live, work, or study within the City of Glen Eira;
  - ii. they are within the allowed age range; and
  - iii. if necessary, they have parental or guardian consent to enter the competition.
- 3. This is a competition of skill.
- 4. To enter the Competition:
  - (a) The entrant must complete the online registration form available at <u>https://www.gleneira.vic.gov.au/services/youth/youth-</u> programs/your-event/wear-it-purple
  - (b) The entry must be submitted by 11.59pm on Sunday 10 August 2025.
  - (c) Artworks must be submitted as a digital (digital template provided) or photographic image.
  - (d) Artworks must be uploaded in a JPEG format no greater than 20 megabits.
  - (e) Entrants must include a summary of their work (of no more than 200 words). This will be used by the judging panel to assist in evaluating the entry against the theme.
- 5. Entries are limited to one per entrant.
- 6. The design of the bookmark:
  - (a) Must be the original artwork of the entrant, and any entries considered to be works of plagiarism will not be accepted.
  - (b) Must not depict violence, discrimination, sexually explicit or other inappropriate material.
  - (c) Must not be generated by Artificial Intelligence (AI).
  - (d) Must not have previously been awarded a prize in an event or competition held by Glen Eira City Council.
  - (e) Must not infringe the intellectual property rights of any other person.

- (f) Must comply with Council's values.
- 7. By submitting an entry, all entrants grant to Council and the Alliance Councils a worldwide, fee-free, transferable licence to use their entry for any purpose relating to Council or the Alliance Council functions, including by publishing their entry on Council and/or the Alliance Councils print and social media. All entrants further consent to any act or omission by Council or the Alliance Councils which would otherwise constitute a breach of their moral rights.
- 8. Other people's rights
  - (a) If an entry contains another individual's personal information (including their image) or another person's work, it is the entrant's responsibility to seek consent from those individuals. Glen Eira City Council may disqualify an entry if it becomes aware that an individual has not consented to their personal information or their work being included in the entry.
- 9. Entries will be judged by a members of the Rainbow Pride Advisory Group and Glen Eira Youth Pride Group Monday 11 August 2025.
- 10. Criteria for judging entries
  - (a) Entries will be judged on the basis of originality and creativity and at the judging panel's discretion applying the following criteria:
    - i. How the artwork represents the chosen theme of *Bold Voices, Bright Futures;*
    - ii. Demonstrated creativity and originality; and
    - iii. Alignment of the story to the artwork submitted.
  - (b) The judging panel decision is final, and no further correspondence will be entered into regarding the judging panel's decision.
- 11. Exhibition and Prizes
  - (a) 20 finalists will be chosen by the judging panel.
  - (b) All 20 finalists' works' will be exhibited at the Glen Eira City Council Gallery and on Council's Youth Services

Instagram pages (**@gleneiraartexpo @gleneirayouthservices**). Names of the entrants will be displayed along with their works. They may also be exhibited by Alliance Councils in a similar manner.

- (c) There will be one winning entry chosen from the 20 finalists.
- (d) The winning entry will be awarded the prize of their design being professionally printed and made into a bookmark. A minimum of 1000 bookmarks will be available in Glen Eira Library branches from [date] until all printed bookmarks have been distributed and all printed bookmarks have been distributed.
- (e) All finalists and the winner will be notified in writing by email within 14 days of the judging panel having made their decision.
- (f) Finalists and the winner will also be publicly announced on Wear It Purple Day on Friday 29 August 2025 via Instagram and mentioned during the Presentation Night for the Youth Art Exhibition on Thursday 4 September 2025. Names of the winners will be published in Glen Eira News, Instagram, and on Council's Youth Services Facebook page.
- (g) At Council's discretion, entries may also be exhibited at any Council premises or on any of Council's internet platforms.
- 12. General
  - (a) This promotion is in no way affiliated with Facebook or Instagram.
  - (b) If for any reason any aspect of this competition is not capable of running as planned, including by reason of tampering, unauthorised intervention, fraud, technical failure or any cause beyond the control of Council, Council may in its sole discretion cancel, terminate, modify or suspend the competition, or invalidate any affected entries, if required.
  - (c) Council is not liable for late, lost, incomplete, invalid or incorrectly submitted entries, or illegible, corrupted or misdirected entries, claims or correspondence due to error, omission, alteration, tampering, deletion, theft,

destruction, transmission interruption and communications failure or otherwise.
